THANK YOU TO SO MANY FOR YOUR GENEROUS GIFTS TO THE MISSION FUND! Session decided to disperse \$500 per month to the PC Food Pantry which will take our giving to them through the winter months. We are also awaiting to hear what will happen with DNA in regards to possibly moving from their current building.

Church Treasurer Report for December 2020

The month of December ended with a large balance, even including a large amount of expenses during the month. This was due to the many donations received for the church's general fund. Much of this is probably due to many members finishing up the year with annual, quarterly or special donations which normally occurs to some degree in December each year.

General Expenses Fund

For the month, \$500 was provided to the Plain City Food Pantry, \$2,225 to DNA-Daily Needs Assistance program, \$750 for Presbyterian Missions, \$300 for the Plain City Church Fellowship group and \$50 for our Deacons. The Judy Walker Scholarship fund received additional donations of \$1,575, so the balance is now \$5,596.

A couple other items of interest: For the year, total donations were made to DNA in the amount of \$3,000 and \$6,500 to the Plain City Food Pantry. An additional \$1,353 was provided to cover special Covid relief for the Pleasant Valley Senior Center. In December the Ohio Bureau of Worker's Comp sent the church another special dividend payment of \$819 as part of the state's additional Covid relief efforts and is included in overall general expense fund donations.

Update on Number of Board Members:

Session decided to change the number of board members beginning with the class of 2021. This decision was made realizing the number of board members for the size of our church seemed out of balance along with the fact that people were serving many years without a break. So beginning in 2021, we will be electing two trustees and three deacons. This will continue each year until the number of board members by 2023 will be six instead of nine trustees, and the number of deacons will be nine instead of twelve. The Elders will remain the same at nine members.

Shut in Visitation If you are shut-in and would like a visit, or if your family member is shut-in and you would like Rev Alice to visit him/her, please let her know.

For the protection of everyone, she will only visit outdoors at nursing homes, assisted living places, or homes with everyone wearing a mask and social distancing. No home communion at this time, unless you or family has the communion elements available and already there for his/her loved one.

- **Dismantling Structural Racism** Listen in on a conversation between Rev. Alice Philips and CBS sports broadcaster James Brown economic and institutional This workshop postponed until a future Matthew 25 event.
- **Eradicating Systemic Poverty** What do we not understand about poverty that is undermining our work to end hunger and homelessness? How are we failing to love and honor the poor? Learn more about the soulkilling structures of poverty and then, in particular, the dynamics of homelessness in the city of Columbus.
- **Building Church Vitality** Our churches are vital when we grow into “a way of life that sees with Christ’s eyes and uses [our] collective gifts to really make a difference.” When elders, deacons, and clergy are ordained, we pray that these men and women will be trained in the school of prayer so that they might express the compassion of Christ for the poor and the troubled. We pray that they will be filled with courage to bear the gospel into the halls of power. How can we teach our people spiritual practices that increase our compassion and support our justice work?

Global Mission Event Mission Engagement 101 White Paper

A five-session (spread over five months) global mission engagement and educational opportunity for individuals and congregations in the Presbytery of Scioto Valley. Each event will focus on a different, foundational aspect of global mission in the 21st century and will additionally feature conversations with mission co-workers from around the world.

The history of global mission is known equally by what God has done in and through it and as an unwitting aid to colonialist and racist injustices. To do global missions well today, then, requires a commitment to understanding the foundation of God’s work around the whole world and wisdom to not repeat past mistakes. Put in another way, if the greatest challenges facing 19th- and 20th-century global mission were travel and language translation, then the greatest challenges facing 21st-century global mission is holistic cultural engagement and the avoidance of paternalism or other unjust power relations. If a lot of that last sentence seemed confusing to you, it won’t after you complete Mission Engagement 101.

Cost: It’s free! **And, in fact, congregations that have three or more members attend all five sessions will receive a \$250 grant from the Presbytery of Scioto Valley to be used for global mission in and through your congregation.** Additionally, all attendees to all five sessions will receive a certificate of recognition from the Presbytery. **Dates/Time:** All sessions will be held on Saturdays from 10:30 a.m. to noon via Zoom. 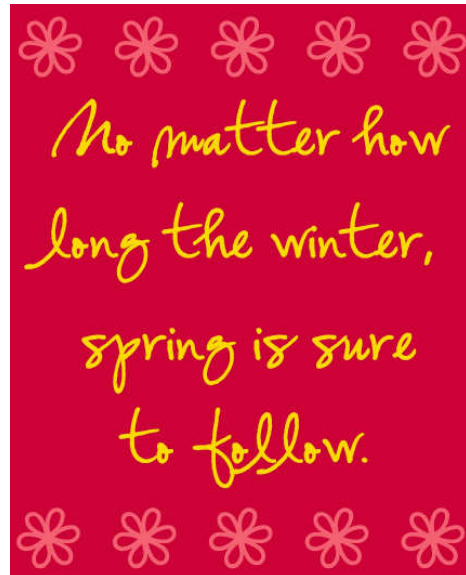
