



### A Heart for Israel



Just this past Sunday I heard Messianic Jewish singer Marty Goetz in concert in Marion, OH. I was reminded once again of my heart for Israel. Actually, I probably have had more encounters and relationships with Jewish people than the average Christian. It began when I was seventeen years old and working at a local restaurant near my home in Pittsburgh. The owner of the restaurant was Norman Herman. Norman was a Jewish man who had watched his family being killed in the Holocaust. That was my first experience with a Jewish individual while growing up. I worked at the restaurant through high school, college, and graduate school. Norman was one of the kindest, most gracious individuals. I remember him and his family celebrating the Jewish holidays, yet he recognized our Christmas and even gave us bonuses at Christmas.

My sister married while I was in high school; and she moved to Squirrel Hill, the Jewish community in Pittsburgh. The majority of neighbors on her street were Jewish. As a matter of fact one of the professors I had in college lived on her street.

After moving to Delaware, OH, for a teaching position, one summer I worked at Christian Psychological Associates in Columbus. The man who owned the practice was a Messianic Jew. That was my first experience of knowing someone who was Jewish and who also believed Jesus was the Messiah. I remember eating lunch with Dr. William Beausay, and he prayed and closed with Yeshua Hamaschiach (Jesus the Messiah). I remember enlightening conversations I had with him that summer.

When I moved to Shadyside, OH, for my first call as a pastor, one of my members worked in a wig and cosmetic shop across from a popular restaurant that I frequented. Florence Mendelson, a Jewish woman, was the owner of the shop. I often would pop in the shop to say hello to the member of my church, and I became friends with Florence as well. Florence and I had conversations about Jesus. She shared with me her difficulty believing in Jesus as the Messiah. She was one of the kindest, most gracious individuals I had ever met. She worshiped with us on a couple of occasions at my church. Actually, I had given her a DVD of Marty Goetz.

I met Marty Goetz on one of my first trips to The Cove. He led worship for the seminar that I was attending. I was so moved by worship...one could feel the Holy Spirit so ever present. When Marty sang in Hebrew it was absolutely beautiful, and you definitely felt he led you into the presence of the Lord. I have heard him numerous times. He often asks people to pray for Israel.

While a pastor in Creston, OH, I was on a return trip from a Presbyterian conference in Minneapolis, I sat next to a man on the airplane. After some initial conversation, we found out we were at the same conference. Rev. Dr. Gerry Mills grew up a Jew and his neighbors invited their family to worship at their church. His whole family came to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior. He went on to become a Presbyterian pastor. I had some of the most intriguing conversations with Gerry throughout the years. He was a brilliant man. He was a Presbyterian pastor yet still held on to his Jewish heritage. He was so eloquent in tying the Old Testament references to Jesus in the New Testament. I always enjoyed his enthusiasm to reach people for Jesus up until the time of his death in his late '80's.

It was while I was in Creston, I also felt an urging to attend a Messianic Jewish Sabbath service. I attended Tikvat Yisrael in Cleveland on several occasions. I loved it! Rabbi Eric Lakatos made the connection between the Old Testament and the New Testament in his sermons. We invited him to come to Creston Presbyterian Church to lead a Messianic Seder meal one Maundy Thursday. People who attended were so amazed at the references to Jesus in the Seder Meal. We invited him to preach on Father's Day, and once again people were touched by his powerful message. He also had asked that I pray for Jewish believers in Messiah.

And most recently, my cousin David married, Sandy, a Jewish woman. She has worshiped here at our church, and she has worshiped at my cousin Tommy's church as well.

So you are probably wondering why I have given you my history with Jewish individuals. I want you to know that I have a heart for Israel. That may help to answer the question, "Why do you pray for Israel on Sunday mornings during the pastoral prayer?" You will hear me pray for Israel that they may come to know Jesus as Messiah. I never pray to convert them to Christianity; because when they come to know Jesus as Messiah, they are Jewish believers. Messianic Jews still maintain their Jewish heritage yet believe that Jesus is the Messiah and celebrate Him as their Lord and Savior.

Not only was I asked to remember in prayer the people of Israel by Messianic Jews, but Scripture encourages us to pray for Israel.

"For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not keep quiet, until her righteousness goes forth like brightness, and her salvation like a torch that is burning." — Isaiah 62:1

I believe the following from Chosen People Ministries explains it so well.

"Tied up in God's climactic plan of redemption is the salvation of the Jewish people. That's really what Isaiah was speaking of in Isaiah 62:1. He was saying, "I'm not going to keep silent until salvation fully comes to Israel." Because the salvation of the Jewish people is so close to the heart of God, it should be close to ours as well. Paul said he magnified his ministry to the Gentiles because through the Gentiles the Jewish people would be saved. (See Romans 11:11–14.) God is counting on the church to pray for the salvation of the Jewish people."

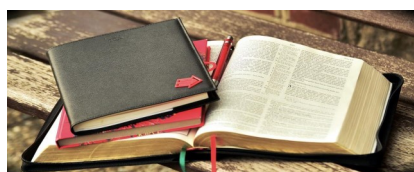

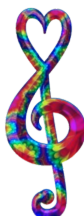
