WHAT'S HAPPENING?

- The Session will be meeting on March 2 to formally vote on the hiring of Rev. • Wendy McCormick as our interim pastor.
- Session is also evaluating whether the church can continue financially with a full-time call or possibly may have to go in the direction of a part-time pastoral call.
- A mission study will be completed involving input from the entire church. •
- A PNC will be nominated and will be elected by the congregation. •
- The PNC will write the MDP which states information about the church and • what the church is looking for in a pastor, and it will be placed online through the denomination's call process for potential candidates to view.
- The search for a new pastor by the PNC will continue until a new pastor is • called.
- A congregational meeting is held after the pastor preaches and is voted on. •
- A new pastor begins serving the church.
- PLEASE PRAY FOR THE SESSION There is a lot to do in the time of transition!!

LENT BEGINS!


March 5 Ash Wednesday at 7 pm

Ash Wednesday worship will be in the Sanctuary on Wednesday, March 5 at 7:00 p.m.

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent with a public act of confession. Acutely aware of our human frailty and our mortality, we repent and turn to our loving Creator, expressing our utter reliance on God's grace. For those who undertake spiritual disciplines in Lent, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten fast.

The imposition of ashes is an optional part of this time of worship. Ashes are an ancient symbol of repentance, sorrow and sacrifice. They also remind us of our mortality as they are imposed with the words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return".

Our Ash Wednesday worship will include a reflection from **Meeting Jesus at the Table,** a Lenten study book by Cynthia Campbell and Christine Coy Fohr. This book connects our experiences of food and tables with the gospel stories about food and feasting and with Holy Communion. On Ash Wednesday, we will consider Mark 6:30-44 and will celebrate the sacrament.

We will begin with chapter 2, page 17. Read Matthew 9:9-13

The Gospels are full of stories of Jesus sharing meals with disciples, friends, even tax collectors and Pharisees. Whether multiplying bread to feed a whole crowd, relaxing with his inner circle, or telling curious elites stories about even greater banquets, Jesus imparts wisdom as he shares the wine and grants forgiveness as he distributes the fish. This eight-chapter resource provides biblical insights along with thought-provoking queries regarding our own time, such as whom should we invite to Sunday dinner and

who is left out and left behind in our culture today.
