A Word from Rev. Alice

Dear Church Family,

Ron Hutchcraft writes... A transformer makes power accessible so it can make a difference where you need it to make a difference. In heaven, God's unlimited power is made available to you through prayer. Maybe today you are facing a situation or you have a need that desperately needs the touch of God's unlim-

ited power. How do you get that unlimited power to meet your need, your hurt, your situation, or the miracle you need? The transformer of God is called prayer. By God's grace, this incredible transformer takes all the unlimited power of God and brings it down to what you're facing in your day and where you are right now. All over the world, Christians can pray at the same time. What an ultimate transformer!

Churches within the Plain City Church Fellowship will be participating in a series PRAY FOR PLAIN CITY! It will be a community wide focus on prayer. Each week from Oct 23-Nov. 20 there will be a certain focus in the sermons. Each pastor will write his/her own sermon but we will focus on a common theme and Scripture.

I will be leading a 30 Day Prayer Pilgrimage beginning Sunday, Oct. 23 for our church family. You will be given materials to follow, and it involves about 30 minutes of devotional time each day. We will then meet on Sunday mornings at 9:15 to discuss and share how the week went for you during the pilgrimage.

The first meeting will be Oct. 23 where I will distribute materials.

**Prayer Covenant:** Another focal point of this focused season of prayer will be invited followers of Jesus in our community to join in a prayer covenant together so that we are agreeing in prayer together throughout the five weeks (and beyond).

May this Season of Prayer transform all of our lives and our community and beyond! Love being your pastor!



## Per Capita Giving Time

**Presbytery has advised the 2022 Per Capita is \$40 per member.** Per Capita is collected by Presbytery and is distributed as shown below. This is how we fund the denomination and has been a part of denomination history for over 275 years.

Presbytery of Scioto Valley: \$27.80

Synod of the Covenant: \$3.25

General Assembly \$8.95

Total: \$40.00.

The Church is responsible to pay the Per Capita for our membership reported in 2020. Session's request to the Congregation is for every member to pay their portion of Per Capita. This will relieve pressure on our General Fund. We would like to request it be paid by October 31, 2022. You can put it in the offering plate or mail to the Church.

LIFEWISE ACADEMY - to begin in October 4!


Tuesday— Friday 9 am until 3:20 pm 7 classes daily.

What is needed? All packaged food in boxes, cans, or pouches. NOTHING that needs refrigeration! Also remember this is a


