Word from Pastor Alice

Dear Church Family,

I am always amazed at Joni Eareckson Tada! She is a Christian. She is a world renowned speaker, artist, singer, and advocate for special needs children and adults. At the age of 17, she broke her neck in a diving accident in the Chesapeake Bay. Her spinal cord was severed, and she became paralyzed from the shoulders down. In addition, she has battled through cancer treatments on two occasions, plus daily physical pain. Her beautiful smile from a wheelchair (she has occupied for more than 50 years) is a tremendous witness of God's grace! I receive her daily devotions in my email each day. Amidst all that Bible Study resumes has happened in our nation and world and individual's lives within the last few weeks, I thought it was worth sharing her daily devotional...

Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior. Habakkuk 3:17-18

This guy had it bad! Can you imagine being a farmer and waking up one morning to see your fig trees and vines bare, the olive orchard dead, the fields barren, and all the sheep and cattle gone? If I were the farmer surveying the scene of devastation, I might have a difficult time rejoicing in the Lord.

REOPENING UPDATES! NEW SAFETY GUIDELINES!

- 1. No longer will temps be taken at the door. If you are not feeling well or have been exposed to Covid, please stay home and watch online.
- 2. All vaccinated individuals are no longer required to wear masks. Due to the rise in the delta variant The Scioto Valley Presbytery in their weekly news today said: It is very strongly advised by our Presbytery Coordinating Team that masks be worn indoors regardless of vaccination status. The Elders of Plain City Presbyterian Church are strongly advising all to wear masks on Sunday morning. This is NOT a mandate. We are leaving the decision up to each individual.
- 3. We know there might be some who are uncomfortable sitting near an unmasked individual. We will have a special pew section by the parlor ONLY as an area for those who still choose to wear a mask <u>and</u> want to socially distance from others. Pews will be marked off with tape in that section only to make it easier to socially distance from others.
 - 4. Sanitizing will still continue.

We will continue to revisit this as things change. Session approved reopening of our building this fall to outside groups with appropriate restrictions.

Hospital Visitation Updates

Rev. Alice contacted the chaplain at Dublin Methodist in regards to the policy for pastors to visit church members who are hospitalized to see if there have been any updates. He shared with her the current policy for Ohio Health hospitals. (which is basically the policy for other hospitals as well)

- 1. A pastor can visit if he/she is listed as one of the two visitors (that is all any patient is allowed) on the patient's chart. Most likely this will not be the case as family members are usually the two listed.
- 2. If patient or family requests the pastor to visit, a contact is made through the chaplain's office. The pastor is contacted by the office for a one time visit.
- 3. If someone is terminally ill, this is an exception...however, visits must still be cleared through the nursing staff.

PLEASE KNOW SHE WILL VISIT ANY CHURCH MEMBER SHOULD YOU OR YOUR FAMILY MAKE
A REQUEST. DURING THIS COVID MESS THAT IS THE ONLY WAY – SHE CANNOT JUST FREELY WALK
INTO A HOSPITAL AS IN THE PAST PRIOR TO COVID.

This makes her heart sad as she believes pastoral calling is an essential part of ministry...but this is the way it is for now. But please know that she will gladly pray on the phone with hospitalized individuals as she has been and will continue to do. She will also gladly visit you at home before surgery to pray in person.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has had long-standing partnerships in Haiti for decades. These meaningful relationships enable us to come alongside communities affected by disaster in the immediate aftermath, as well as support communities planning multi-year, long-term recovery projects. Most recently, PDA is responding to the devastating 7.2 magnitude that struck Haiti the morning of August 14, 2021 that has resulted in the loss of more than 1,200 lives. Working closely with Presbyterian World Mission, our traditional partners on the ground and ACT Alliance, PDA is responding to emergency needs such as WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene), emergency power generators, shelter, food, first aid and more. We remain committed to the long-term recovery.

With Hurricane Ida still so recent here in the US and communication lines are limited, news on their mission is limited but PDA will be there. The need will be great due to the size and devastation of the storm.
