WHAT'S HAPPENING?


- Session is also evaluating whether the church can continue financially with a full-time call or possibly may have to go in the direction of a part-time pastoral call.
- Session is currently working on the mission study with assistance from The Presbytery. Next meeting of the Mission Study Committee is Wednesday, June 4 at 6 pm to discuss survey results.
- A PNC will be nominated and will be elected by the congregation.
- The PNC will write the MDP which states information about the church and what the church is looking for in a pastor, and it will be placed online through the denomination's call process for potential candidates to view.
- The search for a new pastor by the PNC will continue until a new pastor is called.
- A congregational meeting is held after the pastor preaches and is voted on.
- A new pastor begins serving the church.

PENTECOST SUNDAY, JUNE 8th



Join us for the church's special celebration of Pentecost on Sunday, June 8. This is the only Sunday of the church year that the color is RED. So let's make the most of it! ship will include Holy Communion.

The church year is organized around the two great themes of Incarnation (Advent-Christmas-Epiphany) and Resurrection (Lent-Easter-Pentecost), and Pentecost brings that season to a close. Pentecost is celebrated 50 days after Easter and is sometimes called the Birthday of the Church. This holiday commemorates the gift of the Holy Spirit, commissioning disciples then and now to go and share the good news of God's love in Jesus.


